She refused to vote on a procedural move to bring up SB 7 (2-9-16) which would have prevented groups like Planned Parenthood from receiving any state funds.

<sup>4</sup> Voted for HB 416 (02-27-13) (House Committee Substitute) which expanded gambling in Kentucky. It created two new lottery games and expanded casino video slot machines to horse tracks under the auspices of shoring up the state pension fund. It passed the House 52-47 (2-27-13).
