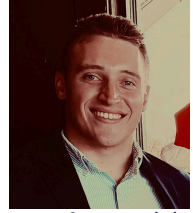

1. Voted against banning gender transitions for kids on HB 470 in 2023 before SB 150 came together later in the session. Voted against SB 150 in 2023.

2. Failed to vote on SB 83 in 2022 which preserved women's sports. Voted against SB 150 in 2023 which included keeping boys out of girls bathrooms. Questionnaire response is contrary to voting history.

3. Voted to legalize sports gambling HB 551 in 2023. Voted against a specific amendment to raise the age to 21. Survey response favored increase minimum gambling age to 21, but is contrary to voting history.

4. Marked "Yes" to life begins at fertilization but also marked "Yes" to exceptions for rape and incest.
