1. Voted against SB 150 in 2019, which enacted constitutional carry. Voted for HB 312 which allows concealed carry for 18 year olds. She is moving in a conservative direction on this issue.
2. Signed CPC's Agreement in Principle document in 2026, affirming that male and female are defined by God at conception. However, Rep. Moser voted against HB 470 in 2023, which prohibited the gender transitions of minors. Rep. Moser has indicated she is moving in a more conservative direction on this issue. In 2025 Rep. Moser sponsored HB 5, which would have banned gender transitions of state prisoners. Also voted for SB 2 in 2025 which banned state funding for gender transition of prisoners.
3. Voted to legalize sports gambling HB 551 in 2023. Voted against a specific amendment to raise the age to 21. Voted for HB 904 in 2026 which increased the gambling age to 21.
